Each certificate combines foundational study in leadership, missiology, and the House of Prayer movement with track-specific formation courses.

Certificate in Christian Leadership Formation

6 courses, 18 credit hours, 48 weeks

Certificate in Missiology and Global Engagement

6 courses, 18 credit hours, 48 weeks

Certificate in Christian Leadership Formation

A formation-focused pathway designed for believers called to lead with Christlike character, emotional maturity, and spiritual authority in ministry, missions, the workplace, and community life.

Certificate in Missiology and Global Engagement

A mission-focused pathway designed for believers called to understand and participate in God's mission through integral mission, African mission perspectives, and global voices shaping contemporary Christian witness.

Certificate in Christian Leadership Formation

This certificate is for believers called to lead with Christlike character and spiritual authority in any sphere, including ministry, missions, nonprofit work, education, business, and community leadership. It is ideal for emerging and experienced leaders who desire deeper formation, stronger discernment, and a biblical foundation for influence that lasts.

Certificate in Missiology and Global Engagement

Who this is for

This certificate is for believers called to participate in God's global mission with spiritual depth, cultural humility, and biblical clarity. It is designed for those pursuing missions, evangelism, discipleship, justice-oriented ministry, and global engagement, as well as leaders who want to understand mission beyond Western frameworks through African and Majority World perspectives.

What you'll gain

- A foundational understanding of Christian mission and missiology rooted in the storyline of Scripture
- A holistic framework for integral mission that unites evangelism and social responsibility
- The ability to engage African perspectives on mission with respect, mutuality, and theological integrity
- Exposure to global voices shaping mission today, including diaspora and Majority World movements
- Practical frameworks for cross-cultural engagement, partnership, and contextual witness
- A deeper prayer foundation through the House of Prayer movement as fuel for mission and endurance

Notes for Students

- Course order is fixed. Students complete courses in the required sequence as part of a guided cohort journey.
- Because courses are taught in a structured flow, students may not take courses out of order.
- This sequencing is designed to build shared foundations in leadership, missiology, and prayer before moving into track specialization.
- Successful completion of all six courses in sequence is required to earn certification.



Program Note for Grading and Auditing

- Students may audit any class and receive a Pass/Fail (P/F) grade. Auditing is a great option for learners who want to grow through the content without pursuing a graded academic record.
- Students who want their coursework to be considered for transfer into degree programs at other institutions should select the graded option, which uses a standard 4.0 grading scale, as transfer policies typically require an official letter grade.
- We are also currently in the process of establishing a preferred transfer relationship with a college partner, and we will share details as soon as that pathway is finalized.

Course Descriptions

CORE 1: Introduction to Christian Leadership

This course introduces leadership as a calling rooted in Christlike character and spiritual formation, not position or platform. Students explore biblical models of leadership with particular attention to Jesus' leadership in the Gospels. Emphasis is placed on identity in Christ, humility, integrity, emotional maturity, and servant authority for leadership in ministry, missions, workplace, and community contexts.

CORE 2: Introduction to Christian Mission and Missiology

This course provides a foundational overview of Christian mission and missiology, tracing the biblical narrative of God's mission from Genesis to Revelation. Students explore key missiological concepts, global mission movements, and contemporary challenges, with attention to Global South perspectives and the shifting center of Christianity. The course equips students to understand mission as participation in the missio Dei, God's redemptive work in the world.

CORE 3: Introduction to the House of Prayer Movement

This course introduces students to the biblical foundations, historical development, and contemporary expressions of the House of Prayer movement. Emphasis is placed on prayer, worship, intercession, and intimacy with God as essential to spiritual formation and mission. Students examine how sustained prayer fuels revival, justice, evangelism, and leadership transformation, and how Houses of Prayer function as spiritual centers in local and global contexts.

Course Descriptions

LEAD 1: The Transformed Leader — Spiritual Formation and Identity for Christian Leadership

This course centers leadership development on inner transformation in Christ. Students explore spiritual formation as the foundation for authority, integrity, discernment, and sustained influence. Emphasis is placed on identity, character, spiritual disciplines, and the leader's inner life, with practical formation rhythms that strengthen obedience to the Holy Spirit and long-term faithfulness.

LEAD 2: Leading Like Jesus — Christ's Model of Servant Authority and Disciple-Making Leadership

This course examines Jesus' leadership model in the Gospels, focusing on servant authority, courage, compassion, truth-telling, and the formation of others. Students study how Jesus led through presence, purity of motive, prayerful dependence, and power submitted to the Father. The course equips leaders to lead people, not simply manage tasks, through Christlike influence in any sphere.

LEAD 3: Emotional and Cultural Intelligence for Kingdom Leaders — EQ and CQ Through a Biblical Worldview

This course equips leaders to grow in emotional intelligence and cultural intelligence as expressions of maturity, wisdom, and love. Students develop self-awareness, emotional regulation, empathy, conflict navigation, cultural humility, and cross-cultural leadership capacity grounded in Scripture and the character of Christ.

Course Descriptions

MISS 1: Integral Mission — Proclaiming and Living the Whole Gospel

This course explores integral mission as a holistic understanding of the Gospel that holds evangelism and social responsibility together. Drawing from Scripture and Global South theological voices, students examine mission as spiritual, social, cultural, and systemic transformation rooted in the life and teachings of Jesus Christ.

MISS 2: African Perspectives on Christian Mission — Theology, Culture, and Witness from Africa

This course centers African theological and missiological perspectives on the mission of God. Students explore African contributions to mission theology, contextualization, indigenous church movements, discipleship, spiritual power, resilience, and the role of the African church in shaping global Christianity. Emphasis is placed on African agency, mutuality, and biblically faithful mission practice.

MISS 3: Global Voices in Christian Mission — Majority World Movements and Contemporary Practice

This course surveys mission theology and practice through global voices, highlighting perspectives from Latin America, Asia, the Middle East, Indigenous communities, and diaspora movements. Students examine how mission is being reimagined from everywhere to everywhere, including themes such as migration, polycentric mission, justice, reconciliation, and contextual Gospel witness.

- A one-time registration fee of \$50 per student is due upon acceptance into your program of choice to hold your spot.

- \$400 per course (3 credits, 8 weeks)
- \$2,400 total per certificate (6 courses, 18 credits)
